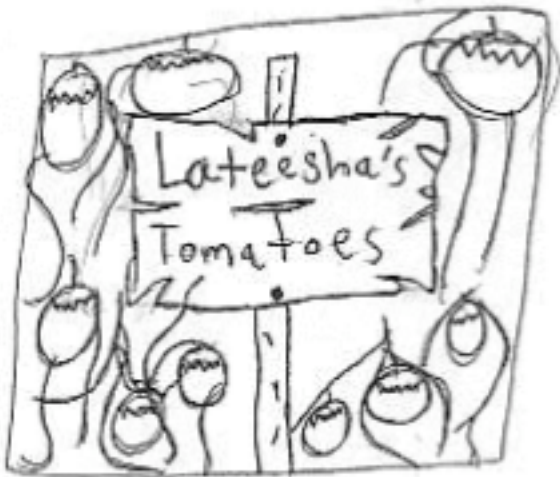
Analyzing Quote from Curtis
